Glenwood school joins nation in reading aloud for Guinness honor

About 175 students and staff members at Glenwood School for Boys and Girls joined a nationwide effort to break the Guinness World Record for the "Most People Reading Aloud Simultaneously in Multiple Locations" while reading a passage from "Charlotte's Web."

The current record of 155,528 people was set in the United Kingdom when 737 schools read William Wadsworth's poem "Daffodils" on March 19, 2004. More than 500,000 readers throughout the nation were expected to participate in Wednesday's world record attempt.

The Glenwood School for Boys and Girls was also part of a schoolwide reading day at Glenwood in which students participated in reading activities in all of their classes. As a residential school, Glenwood serves about 120 students, who come to class on Monday and stay for the week before returning home. - THE TIMES
